### What you will study?

This two-year course focuses on a broad range of issues and societies throughout time.

**Paper 1 (30%):** Breadth Study – Britain Transformed, 1918-97

**Paper 2 (20%):** Depth Study – The USA: Conformity and Challenge, 1955-92

**Paper 3 (30%):** Development Study – Rebellion and Disorder in Tudor England, 1485-1603

Coursework (20%): A 3500-4000 word investigation about either the Holocaust or Communist China.

Understanding the linkages between past and present is absolutely essential basis for a good understanding of the condition of being human. That, in a nutshell, is why History matters.
