A Few Gentle Reminders from the School Office

Contact Details:

Please ensure you inform the school office if you have changed your address or contact details so that we have the most up to date information on our system

Medication:

As spring is well under way and hay fever season is now upon us, we appreciate how uncomfortable this can be for our students – can we advise parents to medicate children at home before coming into school. Antihistamine tablets typically start to work within 30 minutes and may reach their maximum effect in about 2 hours. Medicating before school will also help aid discomfort and limit interruptions during lesson time.

Keeping hydrated in school is very important – please encourage your children to bring in a bottle of water to replenish throughout the day.

Please remind students medication (except epi pen and asthmatic inhalers) are not to be carried on student's person. All medications must come to the front office to be logged and stored away safely in our medical room. If your child requires any medication throughout the day that cannot be left until they return home, please complete the consent form (from the office) and return it to the school office on the first day that the medication is brought into school.


Lost Property:


Please encourage your child to be super organised before they leave for school in the morning so that they have all the items they need for the day including lunches.



Year 11 will work with our guest throughout period 1 – period 3. Year 10 will work with our guest throughout period 4 – period 5.


19th April.

Key Information for families.

Wixams Academy is modifying its behaviour strategies this academic year.

'Phase 1' (September 2022) focussed on 'in-class' behaviour and implementing a more effective system of rewards and sanctions.

'Phase 2' (April 2023) will focus on safe and supervised movement in corridors.

This new system will begin on 18th April when students and staff return from the Easter holiday.

Why is this next phase necessary?

- 1. To ensure movement around a busy Academy is calm and safe.
- 2. To build on to our existing lesson 'Entry Routines' which start lessons in a calm and purposeful way.

What will change and how will we do this?

There will be directional 'pathways' in all corridors and stairwells throughout the building. Students must walk on these lines in single file at all times during transition periods. See an example of a two-way corridor below.

Students will be taught how to move around the building prior to the Easter break.




Supervised Transition.

There will be fifteen key locations that will always be staffed at transition points.

Staff will be pro-active, firm and friendly about the expectations at these times.

The expectations for students will be very simple. Students must walk in straight single file lines. Failure to adhere to what is expected will result in a same day sanction.



We have implemented vastly improved classroom behaviour management systems. We must now focus on maintaining these improvements and doing the same for our transition periods. We thank all families for their continued support as we work through this period of growth and change.
