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This week in assemblies

We have been learning about National Refugee week and focusing on the plight of those forced to leave their homes. 50% of refugees are children, and this shocking statistic helped us to reflect on the significance of showing empathy and understanding and why we should help those in need. We watched a video showing what it might look like if we were forced to flee from the UK and this reminded us that Just because it's not happening here, doesn't mean it isn't happening! We are fortunate to have opened the Academy doors to children who have fled their homes and are pleased that they have found safety within our community.

Half of year 9 & 10 received a fantastic presentation from Cairo from The St Giles Trust this week, which tackled the incredibly important topic of knife crime. Sadly, incidents of knife crime continue to increase in Bedfordshire and as an Academy we feel it is important to teach our young people to be able to keep themselves safe; we also want to educate them about the reasons why carrying a knife is not the way to resolve conflict nor to protect themselves.

The presentation was very engaging balancing Cairos personal experience with facts and myth busting. We have invited Cairo to come back to speak to the remainder of the year group during the next academic year.

We have also partnered with the Idris Elba Foundation and local Bedfordshire charity Dynamic Decisions in order to continue our work around knife crime. These organisations are working together to produce a video to be shared with MPs which will outline how our young people in Bedfordshire feel about Knife Crime, and what they want parliament to do to tackle it. The school day will **finish earlier on this day.** To support dismissing our students and preventing congestion in the car park, we will have a staggered finish to the day whereby parents should come to **collect their children at the following times:**

- Year 7 & 8: 14:30pm
- Year 9 & 10 15:00pm
- Siblings and students that are car sharing will be allowed to go home at the same time

Students are required to bring:

- Lunch and plenty of water (unless they normally get a free school meal this lunch will still be provided)
- Any medication that may be needed on the day even if this is normally stored at school
- Wear full PE kit or sports clothing in the colour representing their 'House'
 - o Full PE kit includes: Wixams' navy polo top, navy shorts and trainers
- Hats, sun cream and clothes to keep warm

To ensure we support parents in getting students to the athletics stadium I have outlined transport provision below. The survey above will help us to ensure all students have transport arranged.

My child normally gets a school bus to get to school:

Students who normally get a school bus will be collected/dropped off at their bus stop as usual and will also be taken to and from the athletics stadium via school bus. Buses will leave the stadium at approximately 14:40pm to take students home going via Wixams Academy before completing the usual bus journey slightly earlier than usual (approx. 10 minutes earlier).

My child does not normally get a school bus to school:

To ensure all students can get to the athletics stadium, the survey will help us to see if parents are able to either drive their child to the stadium or arrange with another parent for car sharing to occur. There is an option for you to let us know if you are unable to arrange transport. Last year, it worked very well where car shares took place due to the capacity of the car park at the stadium as well as capacity of seats on our school buses.

We do ask that as many students who do not get a school bus can find a safe way of travelling to and from the stadium, however we understand that this may not be possible for all.

A group of Bronze participants, who successfully passed their expedition walking to Great Barford from Wixams and for their second day, around the Great Barford area. With our Silver groups, they had a third day on their practice expedition. For their qualifying expedition, we headed off to the Chiltern Hills for three days, where the weather was very kind to us and all groups just finished before the rain came down on the Friday. This group have really pushed up the standards for future years! The expedition was completed by all groups to a very high standard and is definitely a challenge. They were definitely great ambassadors to the school and the wider community! They did themselves proud.

A massive thank you to all staff who have joined us on the expeditions this year. Thank you to all parents who have helped encourage your children to complete the sections – this is the last push for some of them to get there awards this year.
